Key take-aways

- Eligibility for 55+ at the mass vaccination clinics are **not** around the corner
- Health conditions and essential workers who cannot work from home will be next





High-risk health conditions

- Obesity (BMI > 40)
- Other treatments causing immunosuppression (e.g., chemotherapy, immunity weakening medications)
 - Please speak to your treating provider regarding the most appropriate timing of receiving the vaccine. Proof is not required.
- Intellectual or developmental disabilities (e.g., Down Syndrome)



At-risk health conditions

- Immune deficiencies/autoimmune disorders
- Stroke/CVD
- Dementia
- Diabetes
- Liver disease
- All other cancer
- Respiratory diseases
- Spleen problems
- Heart disease
- Hypertension with end organ damage

- Diagnosis of mental disorder
- Substance use disorder
- Sickle Cell Disease
- Thalassemia
- Pregnancy
- Immunocompromising health condition
- Other disabilities providing direct support care in the community

 - COVAx!






Roles

- The roles within your team are:
 - Site Lead/Coordinator
 - Vaccinators
 - Site staff involved in check-in/check-out of patients











Vaccine options

- AZ will be the predominant vaccine
 - Eligibility now 40+
- Moderna distribution is a potential but not guaranteed
 - Dependent on supply and other demands





Inventory Projections

- Unclear and unknown
- We are onboarding additional primary care right now to give plenty of time for getting used to COVAx etc.
- You may be waiting to actually distribute vaccine
